This is a friendly reminder that we had a late change to the school calendar this year that added an early out for our school district this Friday.

Juniors and seniors are eligible to elect open campus. The following actions are required, if you want to be eligible for open campus second semester:

- If you did not submit a form already at the beginning of the school year, your parent/guardian must complete the online form by the end of the day on Monday, January 15th in order for you to be eligible for open campus second semester. Parents may use the link below to allow you to have open campus. This form will no longer be available once the second semester begins.

- Juniors, if your open campus form was submitted at the beginning of the school year, you must notify the office by the end of the day on Friday, January 12th if the period that you are requesting as your open campus needs to change.
- Seniors, if your open campus form was submitted at the beginning of the school year, since you are already eligible to have all study halls and lunch as open, no additional action will be required.

The following are the eligibility requirements for open campus (and open lunch for seniors):

- Lunch period is not open for grades 9-11.
- ADM High School allows **senior students only** to have open lunch. Seniors must meet and maintain the specific criteria to be eligible for this privilege. Check the parent/student handbook for the criteria.
- Students must be passing all of their classes each quarter with a C- and above.
- At each midterm report and semester break student eligibility will be determined based on their midterm progress reports or semester grades.
- If a student is earning a grade below a C-, they will have their open campus/open lunch (for seniors) revoked until the next midterm report or semester break.

- They may earn open campus/open lunch (for seniors) back at the next midterm report/semester break by passing all of their courses with a C- and above.
- Students **must** maintain regular attendance and meet the behavior expectations outlined in the Student/Parent Handbook.
- Any absence that is determined to be “skipping” will result in the loss of open campus/open lunch (for seniors) privileges for 90 days.
- Seniors may have open campus during any study hall and during lunch. Juniors may have open campus during any one study hall. The period must be designated on the online open campus form. Freshman and sophomores are not eligible for open campus.

Counseling Center - Previously Released:

All students taking a DMACC online class second semester: Remember you are required to report to the counseling center during your first semester online class period time, or during a study hall or during tutoring. Students required to report for online classes 5th period will eat "C" lunch. Please report to the media center at the beginning of 5th period.

College Spotlight:

Want to learn about different colleges? Check out the College Spotlight bulletin board located next to the counseling center. The counseling staff will be featuring dozens of colleges throughout the school year.

The new college spotlight is on Northwest Missouri State University. Northwest Missouri State University is a state university located in Maryville, Missouri. Founded in 1905 as a teachers college, it offers both undergraduate and graduate programs. Northwest offers 127 undergraduate programs and 40 graduate programs. The business, education, geography and agriculture departments graduate the largest number of students each year.

Northwest currently has around 7,000 students. This size of campus offers great opportunities for students to succeed socially, as well as academically. With a student to teacher ratio of 20 to 1, you never feel like a number and receive personalized attention from faculty. Northwest is a true advocate of profession-based experience.
