



Safety and Security Updates

On Monday, the ADM Board of Directors completed an annual review and approval of the district's Emergency Operations Plans (EOP). Below are a few updates and reminders:

- Increased Law Enforcement Presence: ADM families will continue to see increased law enforcement
 throughout all ADM buildings during the 2024-25 school year. In addition to ADM's School Resource
 Office (SRO) Monte Keller, ADM has hired Joel Delaney to serve as a second SRO. Additionally, ADM
 has hired Gordy Shepherd, retired Police Chief of the Adel Police Department, to provide security
 services for the 2024-25 school year.
- Secured Entries: All ADM attendance centers now have secured entries. ADM families will notice new
 secured entrances at both ADM Middle School and ADM High School. Both buildings are implementing
 new policies and procedures for entry, which includes a buzzed entry system at the main entrance of
 each building.
- Reporting Threats: Safety of students and staff continues to be one of our district's top priorities.
 Families are reminded that they can report possible threats to the safety of students or school personnel on school grounds or at school activities by calling 911, using Safe + Sound Iowa or the ADM Thread Reporting Form. Use the following link to learn more: Report a Threat

Building Handbooks - Parent Signature Required Due to Recent Legislation

On Monday, the ADM Board of Directors approved all building handbooks for the 2024-25 school year. Due to legislative changes, all **ADM families are now required to sign a form acknowledging receipt** of a school handbook for the building that their child attends prior to the start of the school year. New PK-8 ELA Resources

Last year, ADM finished a two-year curriculum revision process to review and adopt new curriculum resources to support English Language Arts instruction in grade PK-8 at ADM. The process focused on identifying components of effective reading and writing instruction and then identifying resources that would help bring this instruction to our students in all classrooms. This year, teachers in all PK-8 buildings will be working to implement the new resources throughout the school year.

Amplify CKLA was selected as the instructional resource that best aligned to support exemplary ELA instruction in grades PK-5, and Amplify ELA was selected to support exemplary ELA instruction in grades 6-8. Buildings will be sending home more information to families about these new resources throughout the school year. We are excited about these new resources and the learning opportunities ahead for students as we work to meet our mission of high levels of learning for all!
